Dear fifth grade students and families,

Attached you will find information and guidelines regarding our grade 5 reading contest to encourage and celebrate the love of reading. Miss Annis (Literacy Specialist, grades 5-8) has visited all fifth grade ELA classes to explain the project and showed students examples of past projects.



This **optional project** is open to all 5th graders.

Book selections may be fiction or nonfiction, but should be a favorite book close to each child's heart. It may be a picture book, a short story, or even a chapter book. Trifold posters that fit the size requirements are available through students' ELA teachers for a cost of \$2 (discounted price vs. local stores).

Projects will be **due no later than Monday, February 25th (Monday after vacation)** in order to give members of the Ahern staff time to vote on the top 10 projects.

On Friday, March 1, 2019, the fifth grade will celebrate NEA's Read Across America Day in honor of Dr. Seuss's birthday. We will have special guest readers from our community in that morning to help encourage a renewed love of reading with students. In the afternoon, we will come together as a fifth grade to celebrate reading, recognize all of the participants, and learn who created the top 10 projects in fifth grade!

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Project requirements and guidelines:

Each student will create their project on a trifold display board. In order to save families time and money, the Ahern Middle School has pre-purchased trifolds in one uniform size that your child can buy here at school for \$2.

The display may not protrude from the top, bottom, or sides. Projects may be hand written or typed.

General Elements to be included on *every* display board:

- Title
- Author/illustrator
- Publisher and copyright date
- Explanation why this is a favorite book

If you choose a *fictional text*, you must also include:

- Main characters
- Setting
- Brief plot summary (conflict, 3-5 main events, resolution)

If you choose a *non-fiction* text, you must also include:

- Nonfiction structure of the text and how you know
- Author's purpose with evidence
- Summary of the main ideas found within the text
